I am requesting funding for the Forsyth County Sheriff's Office Crisis Intervention Response Team Expansion project in Fiscal Year 2026. The entity to receive funding for this project is Forsyth County, located at 110 E Main St, Cumming, GA, 30040. The funding would be used for the expansion of Forsyth County Sheriff's Office Crisis Intervention Response Team (CIRT), including personnel salaries and benefits for the licensed clinician and a sheriff deputy position, supplies, transportation, technology, and administrative costs, to form a co-response team to answer mental health calls for service. This team works to de-escalate situations and connect individuals suffering from mental health crisis to the services they need.
