Dear Chairman Cole and Ranking Member DeLauro,

I am requesting funding for the Old Alabama Bridge Replacement project in Fiscal Year 2026. The entity to receive funding for this project is the City of Johns Creek, located at 11360 Lakefield Drive, Johns Creek, Georgia, 30097.

The funding would be used to replace two aging bridges over Johns Creek, Georgia that are structurally deficient. The project is an appropriate use of taxpayer funds because it will provide significant benefits to the residents of the Northern Atlanta Metro Area by improving safety, resilience, and multimodal connectivity. The project will enhance safety for motorists, emergency responders, reduce flooding risk, and expand pedestrian access to key community destinations. The aging bridges that were built in 1956, and they are no longer sufficient to meet to accommodate the current volume of traffic of 16,300 cars and meet the demands of the growing population. This project addresses critical public safety, infrastructure resilience, and multimodal connectivity needs for a rapidly growing suburban community.

The project has a federal nexus because the funding provided is for purposes described in 23 USC 133.
