Dear Chairman Cole and Ranking Member DeLauro,

I am requesting funding for Roswell's Norcross Street Bridge Replacement Project in Fiscal Year 2026. The entity to receive funding for this project is the City of Roswell, located at 38 Hill Street, Roswell, GA, 30075.

The funding would be used for construction to replace an aging bridge that was originally built in 1951 and is reaching the end of its useful life. The project is an appropriate use of taxpayer funds because it will replace the bridge before its closure or failure causes significant harm to the local economy. The bridge is an integral component of Roswell's transportation system, with over 18,000 vehicle trips daily. The closure of the bridge due to safety concerns would negatively impact traffic and quality of life of residents. The failure of the bridge would impose significant damage to the local economy, and impact residents and the workforce. The new bridge will be a safe, efficient, and sustainable transportation asset for the next 75 years.

The project has a federal nexus because the funding provided is for purposes described in 23 USC 133.
